Highlights:

Head Start Federal Review: Focus Area 1

• Head Start & UDMO admin completed a federal reviewed the first week in March which encompassed interviews and data tours in the areas of: governance, leadership, program design, staffing, education, health, family services, and fiscal infrastructure to ensure compliance with Head Start regulations. The official report should arrive mid-April.

Legislation & Advocacy:

- March 11 from 8 10am: Iowa Community Action Agencies and Head Start Directors from across Iowa gathered for a Legislative Breakfast at the Iowa State Capital. Julie and Sarina met with Representative Wills, Jones, and Meyer to discuss the impacts of recent early childhood funding changes on working families, the economy and availability of full day child care/preschool opportunities due to recent and impending changes with Shared Visions, WRAP, and Statewide Voluntary Preschool. The following day, Julie was able to connect with Senator Evans, who is also the Education Subcommittee Chair. He was supportive of FaDSS, but highly interested in the impacts of WRAP, Shared Visions and Statewide Voluntary Preschool funding changes. Potential impacts on UDMO children and families were discussed. Additional information was submitted at the Senator's request.
- March 12 2:30-4:30pm: The FaDSS staff and Julie spoke to Representative Wills and Meyer along with Senator E vans. All were very supportive of the work our FaDSS program accomplishes.



- Liheap (Low Income Household Energy Assistance Program) starts Oct. 1st for a household with an elderly (60 years of age or older) and/or a disabled household member. Also, any household in a crisis related situation may apply for Liheap in October. Everyone else can apply Nov. 1st thru April 30th.
- LIHEAP APPLICATIONS: For February, Outreach took and processed 266 Liheap applications.
- 11 applications were denied.
- 3 online applications.
- YTD TOTALS: From 10-01-2024 to 2-28-2025: Total Liheap applications processed 3,856
- ECIP/CRISIS: For February, 1 household received ECIP-Crisis funds in the amount of \$3,950.00.
- At this time, we are not assisting with crisis for Service Continuity, due to applicants are protected from being disconnected from the Moratorium during Nov. 1 April 1. Soon we will be starting this back up again.
- We are working on a new State Liheap System.
- We are working on our regular contract called Liheap-25.

- Respiratory illnesses and stomach flu have impacted staff and children's attendance, causing it to drop below 85%. We encourage families to follow health precautions to help minimize the spread of illness.

It Takes a Village

On Valentine's Day I received a call from another UDMO Program Director. He said there was an individual at a convenience store who was experiencing homelessness after fleeing domestic violence. He and his staff took her some emergency food items but she had nowhere to go and had already been outdoors in the cold for a few days. He told her to stay where she was because I was on my way.

While en route I remembered I had a landlord who had just notified me of a vacant rental in the same town. I called her and even though she had a date with her husband for Valentine's Day she graciously agreed to meet me later that same day to have the individual sign a lease if she was interested. I picked up the client and took her to the Outreach to complete the application for Tenant Based Rental Assistance. She was eligible and very interested in the available rental unit. We went to meet the landlord and the client was able to sign her lease and move in that same day.

She didn't have anything but the clothes on her back. It was bittersweet, although we were able to secure a rental, I felt bad leaving her in the apartment with absolutely nothing. Thankfully the landlord had a bed she could use but she had no blankets or pillows – none of the comforts we often take for granted. Either way the client was grateful just to be in out of the cold. On my way back to the office I called and spoke with a staff member who just happened to be cleaning out a closet and she was happy to donate a few items, she agreed to run home to get them for me. She donated many nice things including pillows, blankets, clothing, towels, along with some other household and personal items. I was able to take the items back to the client the same day. The client was so appreciative for all of our help.

The day left me feeling grateful to be a part of the wonderful work we do and also appreciative for the <u>STELLAR</u> staff and landlords I get to work with every day. The situation for the individual may not have turned out as well as it did if she had been overlooked by the UDMO Program Director and his staff who were at the convenience store that day. Without the superb landlord collaboration, we may not have been able to get the client housed right away. We really do have a great group of compassionate people at UDMO and together with our community partners we do amazing things!!!

Statewide Crisis Line Update: Clients in need of rental assistance should call the Statewide Crisis Line at 1-833-739-0065 to complete the intake process. Normal business hours are 7am – 8pm. Clients calling outside of these hours will need to leave a message and wait for a call back. Due to the colder weather and higher need there are some delays, call backs are being made within 3-5 business days.

One of the best things about being a FaDSS specialist is the opportunity to support others and help them to celebrate their accomplishments, big and small. Sherry enrolled in FaDSS as she was being released from a local alcohol treatment center. She was eager to be back on her own with her three sons. She has the support of her mother but otherwise had very little help. She was determined not to fall back into the old patterns. She went through a certification program for phlebotomy and started working at the local hospital. She is planning now to return to college this month to be a lab tech. She has chosen to do this in 3 years instead of 2 because she realizes that the stress of working, going to school and being an independent mother of 3 young boys might threaten her sobriety. Watching Sherry grow and find her place has been amazing. Even after a recent bout of covid, she is able to reach out for the help she needs, brush herself off and continue forward. I am glad that FaDSS can be a part of the support system she has built up.
